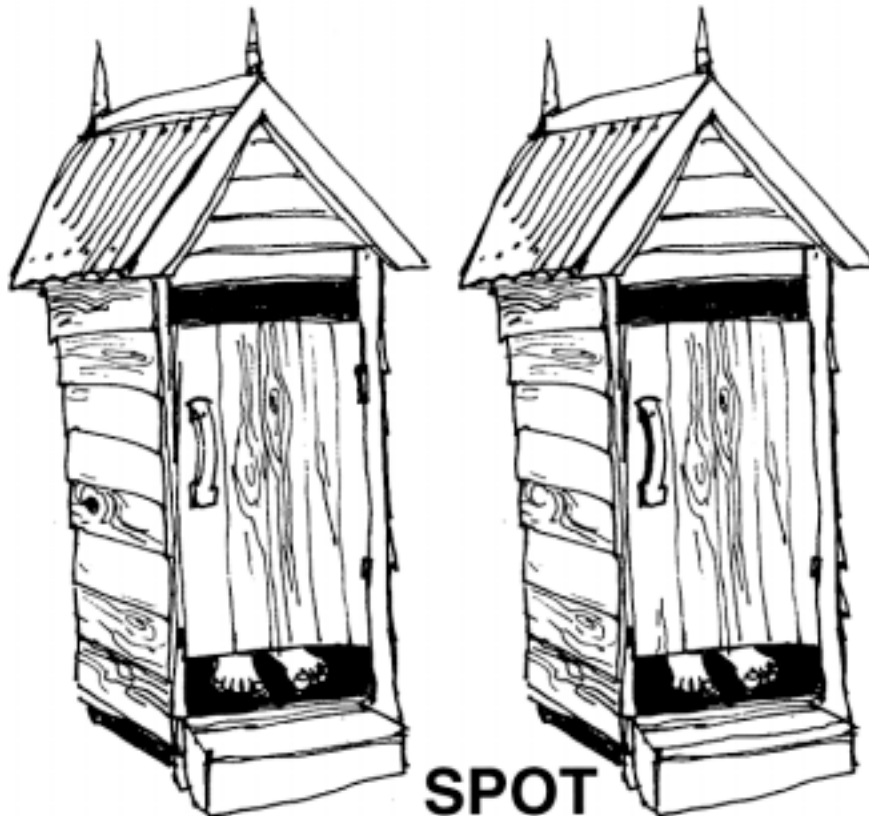

## DID YOU KNOW??

- Thirty-six families in Henderson were having their night soil collected by the night soil man in July 1964. Collection ceased in September 1964.
- Wastewater from New Lynn, Kelston and parts of Glen Eden was once piped to big tanks on Green Bay Beach, then released into the Manukau Harbour.
- Kelly Tarlton's Underwater World was the holding ponds complex for Auckland's sewerage system. These ponds were opened and drained into the harbour on the outgoing tide.
- About 280 million litres of treated wastewater is released into the Manukau Harbour daily. This is the equivalent of one petrol tanker every three seconds!
- ...where the word "Loo" comes from? It originates from the French "Gardez l'eau" ("Watch the water!") This was yelled as the contents of the potty were thrown out the window into the street.
