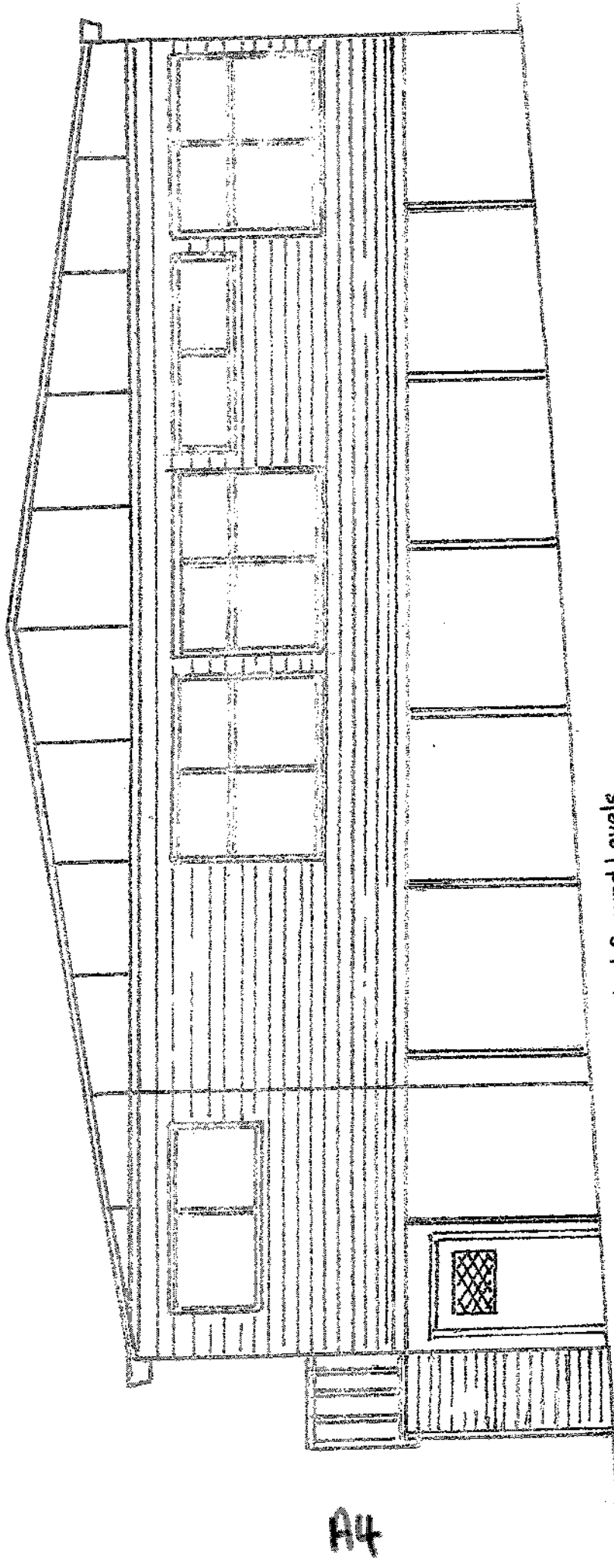

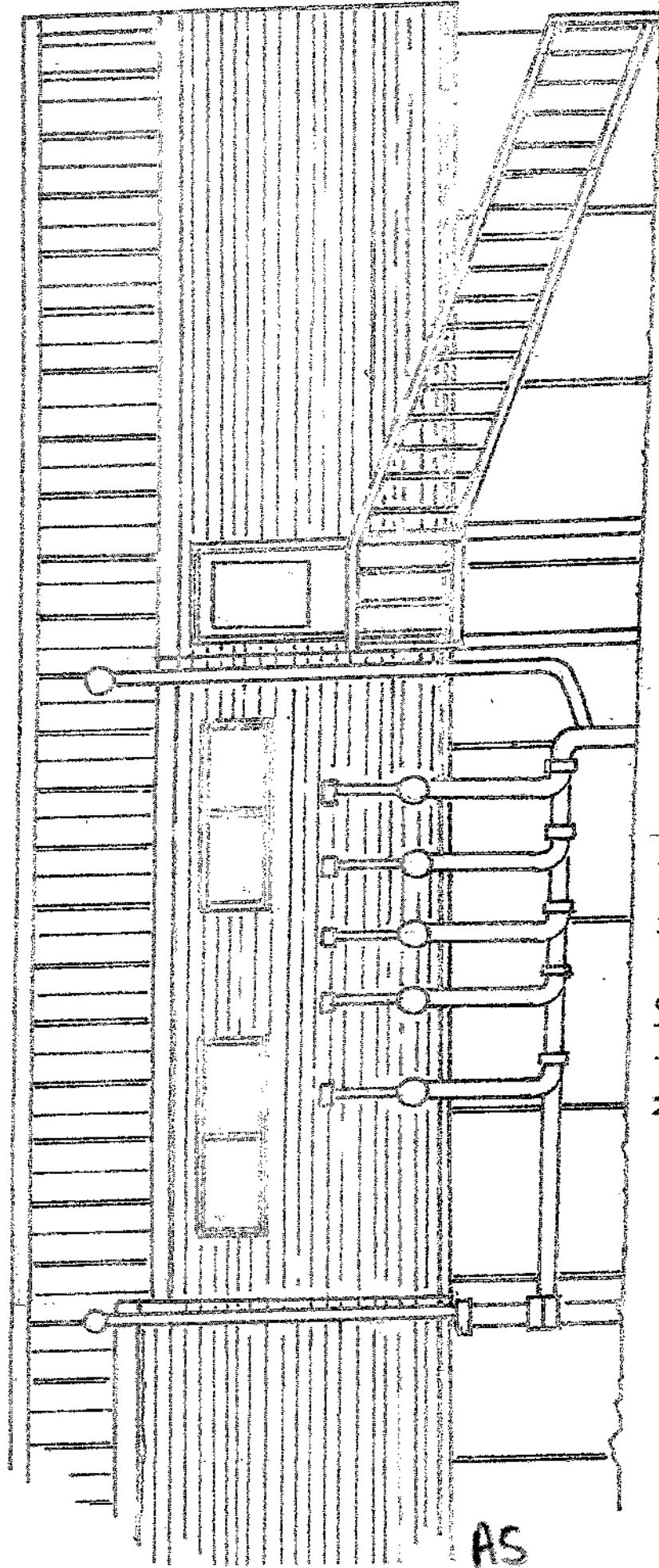

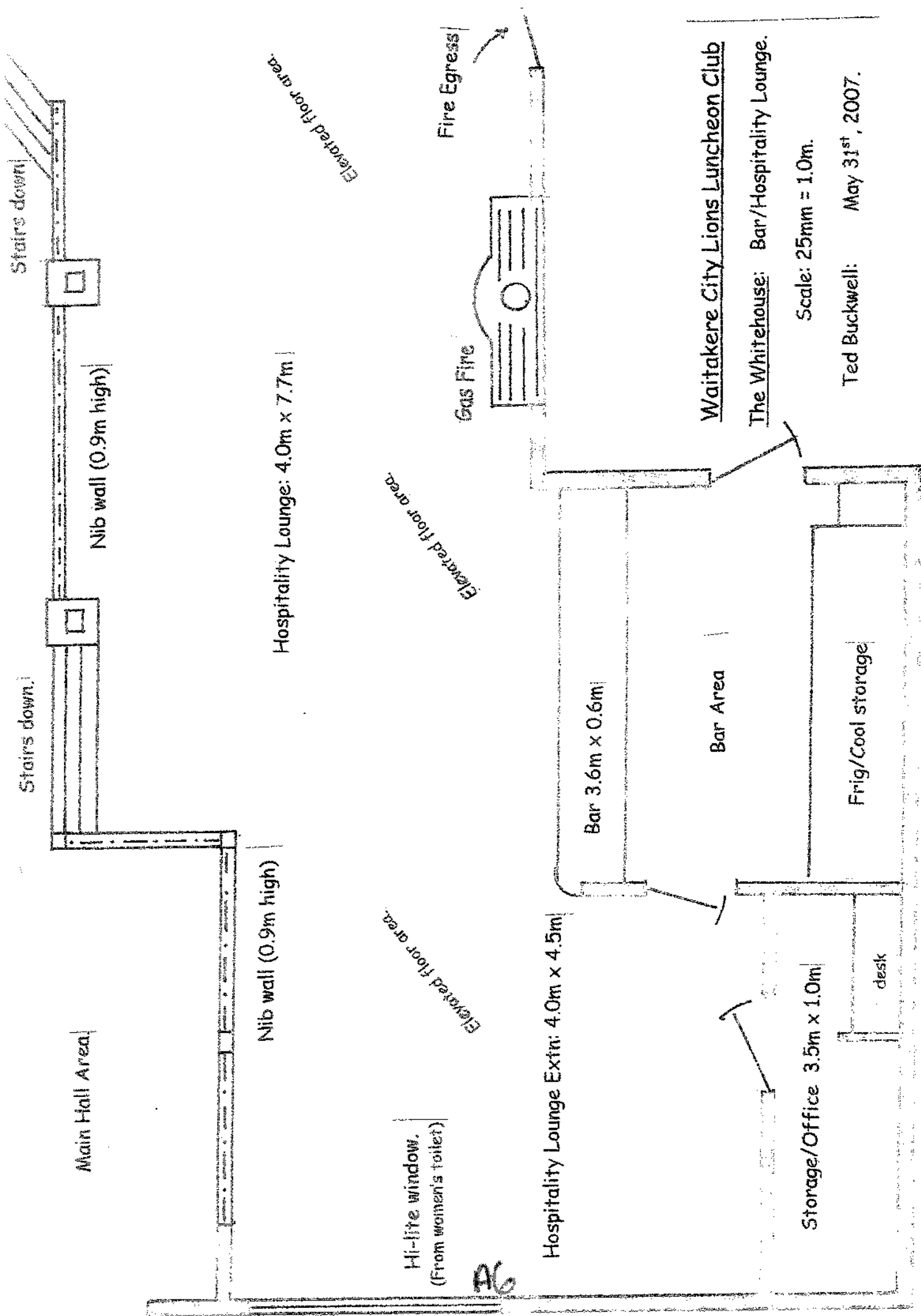

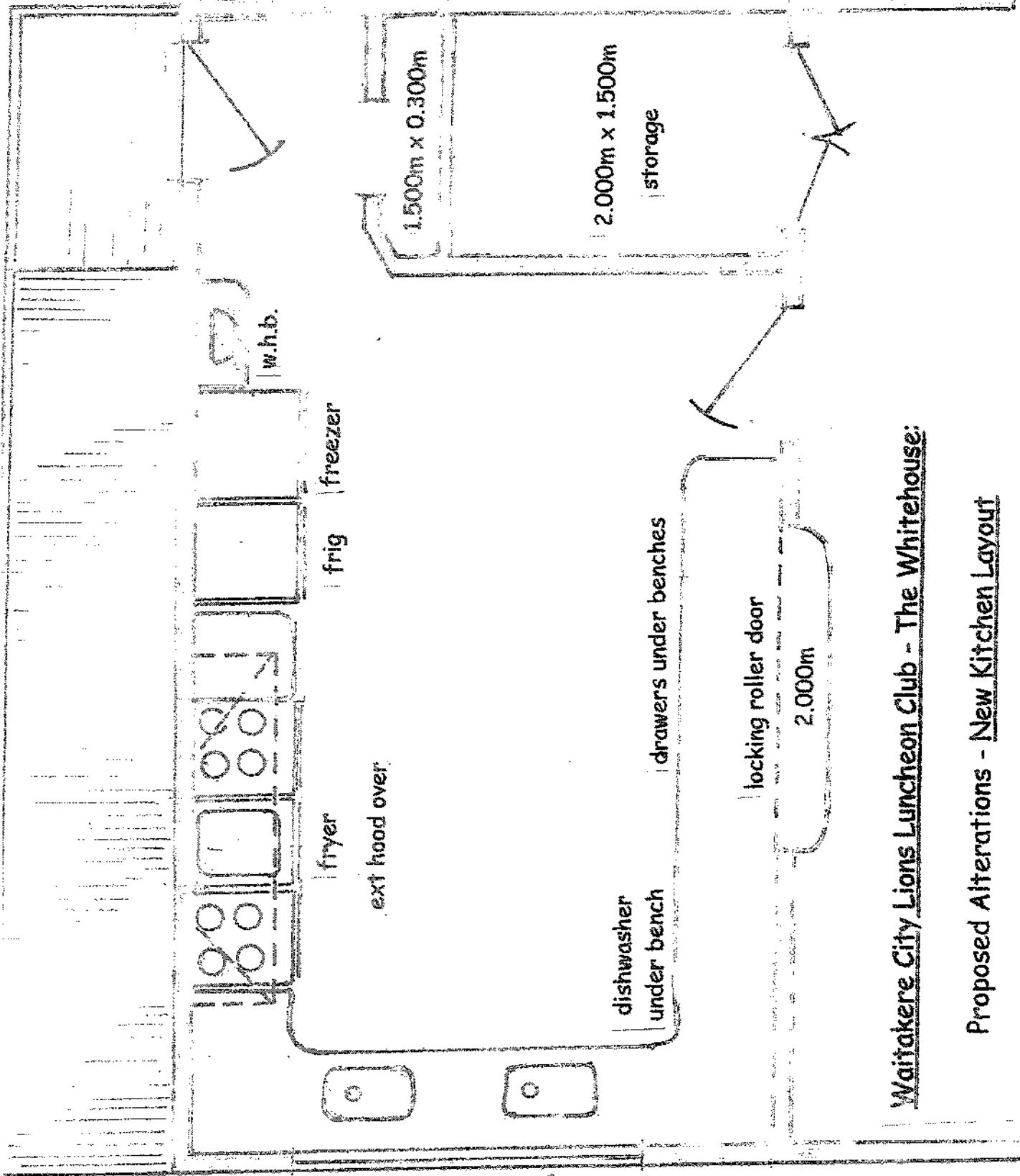

Proposed Alterations - New Kitchen Layout

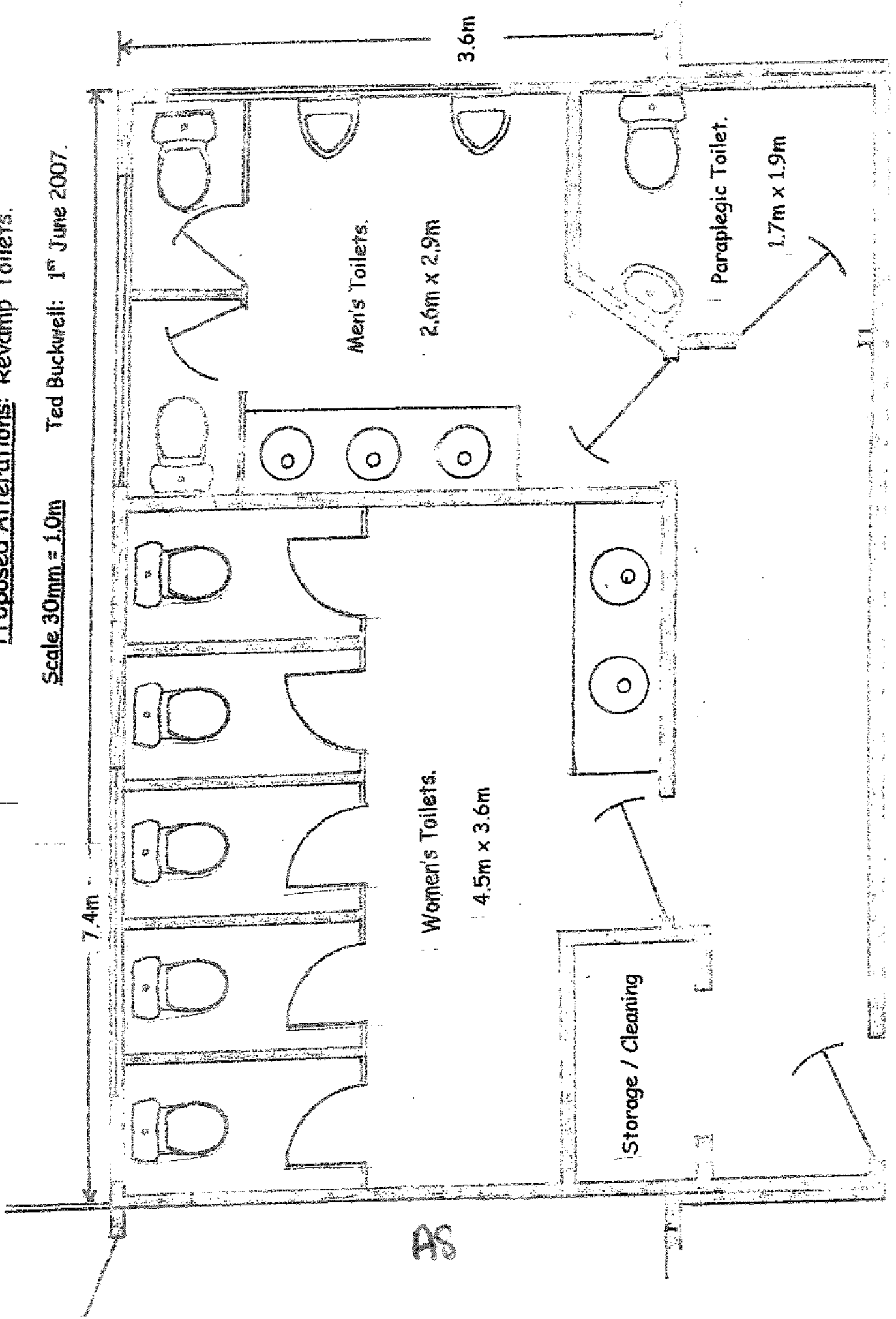

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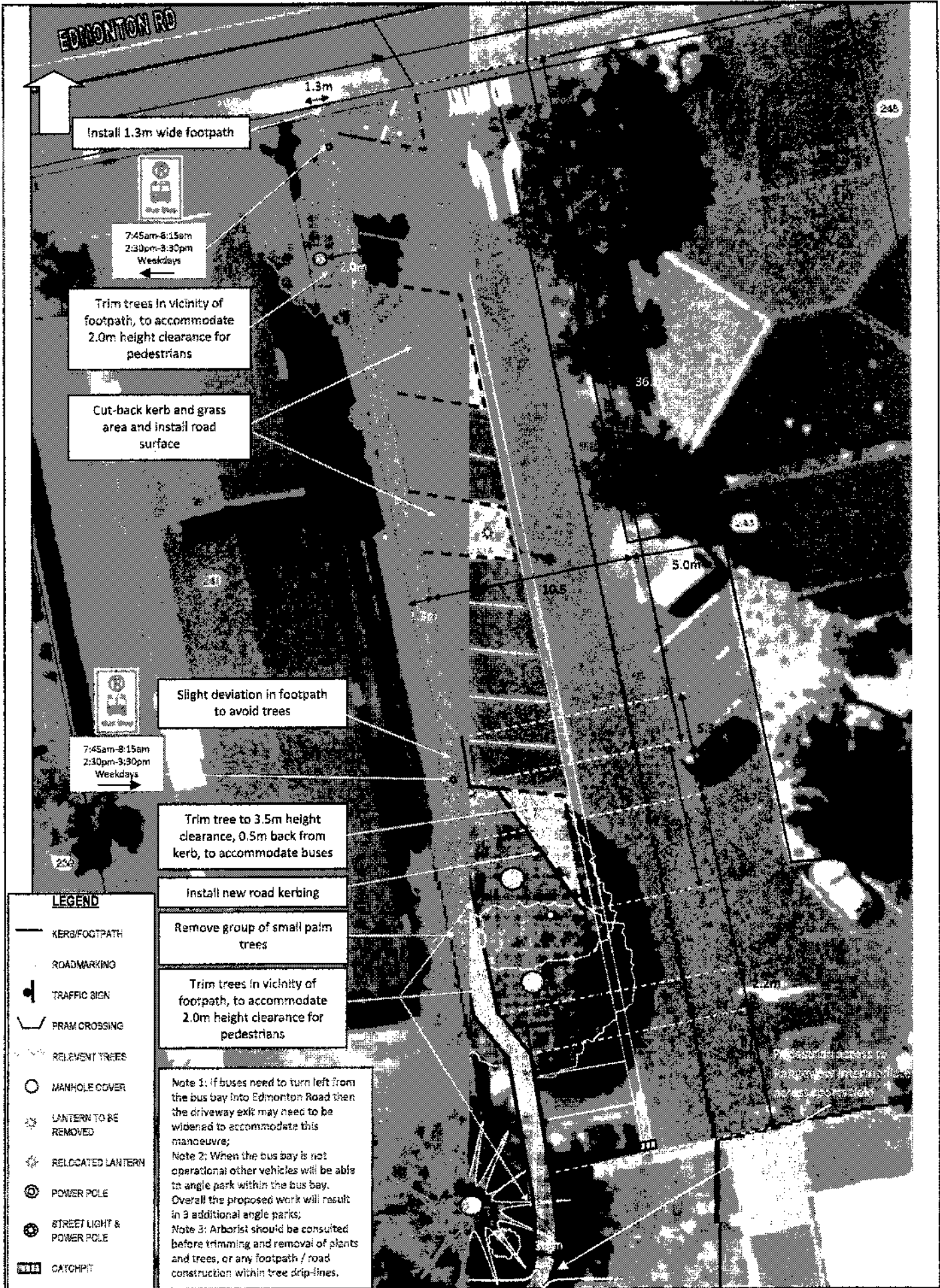

Install 1.3m wide footpath

7:45am-8:15am
2:30pm-3:30pm
Weekdays

Trim trees in vicinity of footpath, to accommodate 2.0m height clearance for pedestrians

Cut-back kerb and grass area and install road surface

Slight deviation in footpath to avoid trees

7:45am-8:15am
2:30pm-3:30pm
Weekdays

Trim tree to 3.5m height clearance, 0.5m back from kerb, to accommodate buses

Install new road kerbing

Remove group of small palm trees

Trim trees in vicinity of footpath, to accommodate 2.0m height clearance for pedestrians

Note 1: If buses need to turn left from the bus bay into Edmonton Road then the driveway exit may need to be widened to accommodate this manoeuvre;
Note 2: When the bus bay is not operational other vehicles will be able to angle park within the bus bay. Overall the proposed work will result in 3 additional angle parks;
Note 3: Arborist should be consulted before trimming and removal of plants and trees, or any footpath / road construction within tree drip-lines.

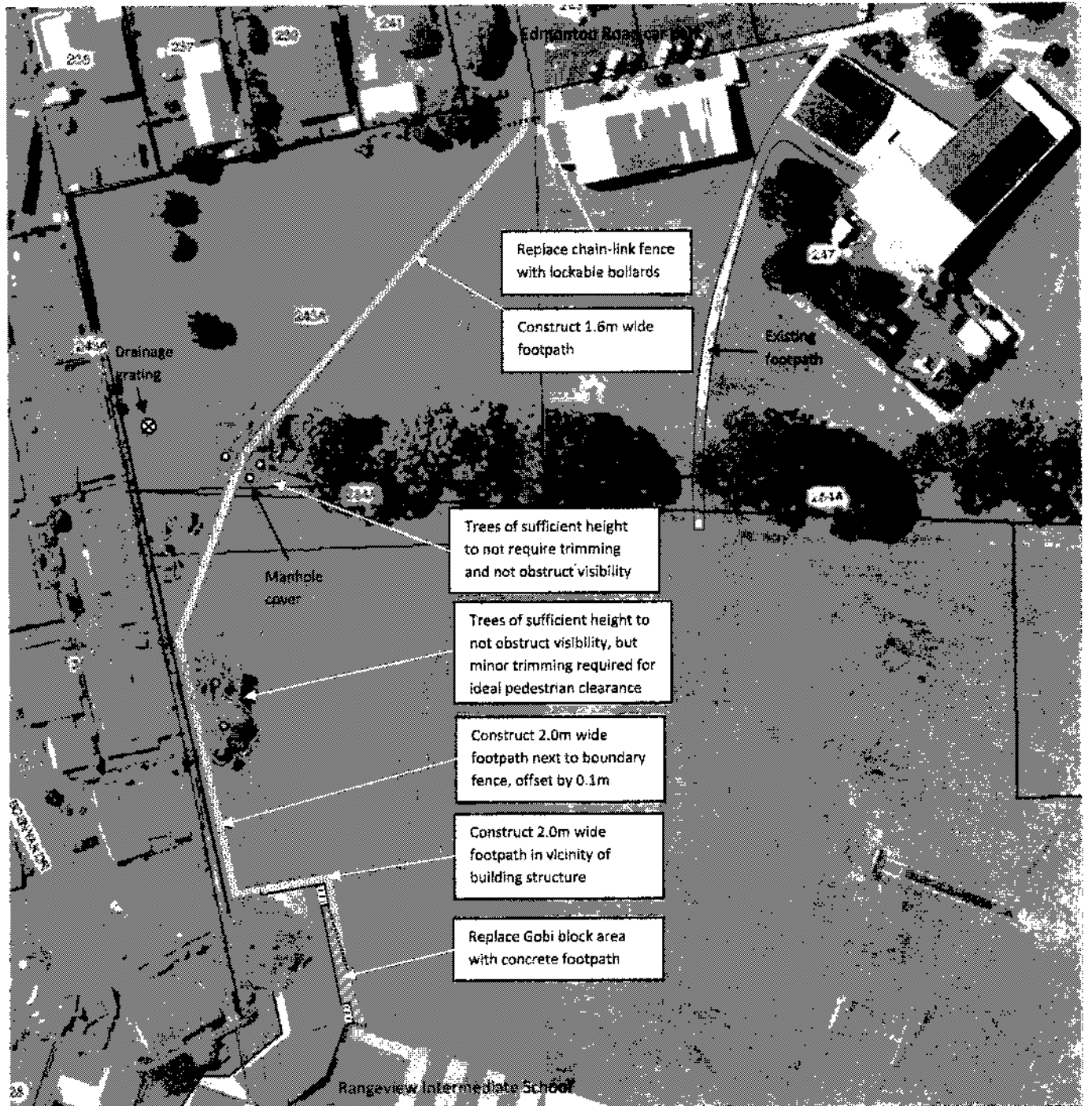

Replace chain-link fence with lockable bollards

Construct 1.6m wide footpath

Trees of sufficient height to not require trimming and not obstruct visibility

Trees of sufficient height to not obstruct visibility, but minor trimming required for ideal pedestrian clearance

Construct 2.0m wide footpath next to boundary fence, offset by 0.1m

Construct 2.0m wide footpath in vicinity of building structure

Replace Gobi block area with concrete footpath

Note 1: The entire footpath has a length of around 205m;
 Note 2: It is recommended that the chain-link fence be replaced with lockable bollards to allow easier pedestrian access and to gain greater control over vehicle access.



Would the following comments be considered in drafting management plans for the reserves listed below. I consent to submitter details being used by Waitakere City Council Parks Planning.

- 1. Bosun Reserve:** The small playground is hidden away and needs upgrading. It should be re located and upgraded to a larger reserve in the northern sector of Te Atatu Peninsula.
- 2. Durham Green :** I support the retention of a girls guide hall at this reserve if a more suitable park is not possible. The hall suffers from constant graffiti and vandalism. If the renovation of the Te Atatu Community Centre could incorporate the Te Atatu Community House, then the girl guides might be re located to the community house at Kaumatua Reserve.
- 3. Halyard Common Reserve:** There are two problems affecting the use of this reserve by the public.
 - a) dog poo from un controlled dogs and ignorant dog owners.
 - b) vehicle access. The reserve can be accessed from 3 roads (Halyard Pl, Wakarua Ave, Waimanu Bay Dr) and it is subject to cars regularly driving across it. Reckless driving of cars occurs often on a friday or saturday evening. The Council must look at strategies to restrict vehicle access on to this reserve. This request has been made for the past 5 years.
- 4. Harvest Reserve:** this reserve is no longer called by this name. It was changed to George Ward Park in 2006.
- 5. Harbourview Rd and Beach Rd corner reserve:** not in your list of reserves. Council should either landscape it or sell it. If they sell it then the proceeds should be used for park development in the Waimanu Bay area of Te Atatu Peninsula.
- 6. Jack Pringle Park :** I support the retention of this open space for community sport and recreation. I would object to the expansion of any area currently being leased to community groups(Pringle Park bowling and Tokelau pre school) . Jack Pringle Park needs a single public toilet. There are many users of the park for both formal and informal sport and there is often a demand to use a toilet. The nearest toilet is located in the town centre, some 300m away , but is too far away when involved in formal sport, or when you have young children who need to use a toilet quickly. A toilet next to the tin sheds of the bowling club is not a bad place.
- 7. Kaumatua Reserve:** the reserve area behind the shops needs a good tidy up. I support the retention of the tennis club and courts but would like to see better provision of public courts. There is no signage to state there are public courts and access is not obvious. The surface of public parking near the tennis club is rather poor and this area could be upgraded significantly.
- 8. Kervil Park :** this reserve is underutilised. The view into the park is restricted being surrounded by houses, but the large open space should be better utilised in some way to cater for the immediate neighbour hood. It would be a good site for an urban bike adventure course with earth jumps/contours. This would provide a safe venue for children/youth to use their mountain/bmx/performance bikes in weekends and school holidays. This form of child/youth recreation would be better than a playground which would suffer much vandalism and a skate board facility which residents may complain about the noise of the boards on concrete.
- 9. Ramlea Park :** I support the retention of the open space for community sport and recreation. Currently it is used by athletics, football and other sports allocated by Council. There is a restriction on football using it for adult games but I believe there should be no restriction on what age groups use it. It is a public open space and neighbours need to get use to this.
