Subject	PARKING CONSULTATION

Dear Directors

This memo is a summary of the parking consultation conducted prior to Christmas. This highlights the stakeholder groups we have met with and their key issues.

At this stage of the consultation we obtained feedback from stakeholder groups about 3 options for regulatory approaches to parking:

- Option 1 – Minimum parking requirements with flexibility
- Option 2 – Maximum parking requirements with flexibility
- Option 3 – Strict maximum parking requirements

4 Dec	WCC staff	Inconsistency of rules between District Plan, Parking Guidelines and potentially the proposed Parking Plans. Inconsistent treatment at different town centres and corridors. Timing of introduction of paid parking.

In summary, there are a lot of concerns about changing the approach to parking because of concerns that this will lead to the parking on-street being used up and the introduction of paid parking. People are not ready for changes yet and are concerned about the risk of introducing changes before improvements to public transport. I have indicated that changes to the District Plan are not likely until 2013-2015. The economic recession is likely to defer investment and any consideration of introduction of paid parking in town centres. There was some confusion as to the meaning of the term "parking maximums". Some stakeholders understood this to mean providing as much parking as possible. There was concern that immediate issues such as those relating to overspill and park and ride should be addressed at the earliest stage and also that the promised improvements to public transport might not eventuate.

The turnout to these meetings was quite low, but the quality of the discussion was very good. Many of the issues were shared by the different stakeholder groups. The due date for feedback was 10 December (but extensions were offered to the end of December if required). A total of 66 written responses were received, some from organisations that we did not meet with.

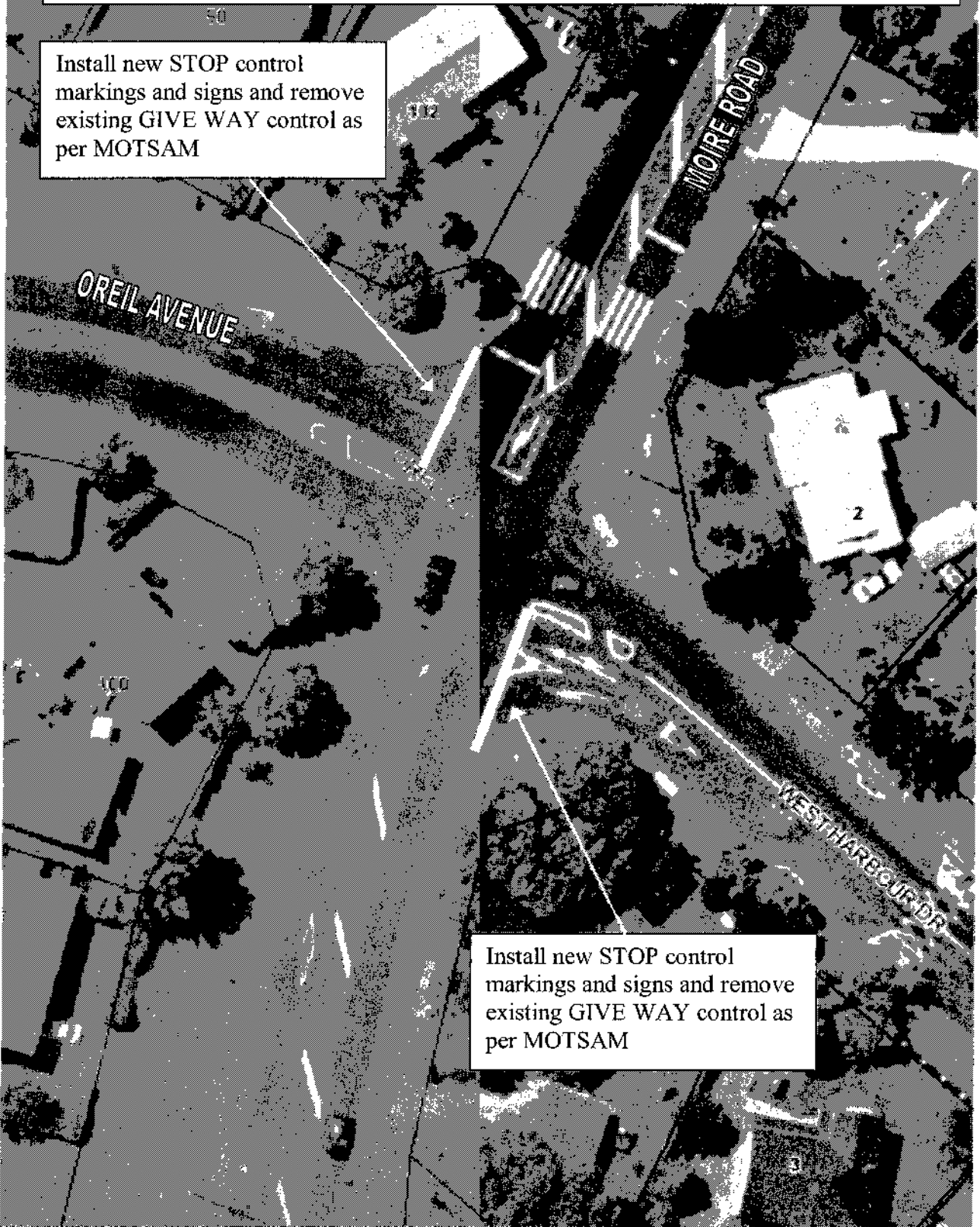
Charlie Inggs is preparing a report to the Policy and Strategy Committee meeting on February which outlines the feedback and proposes the basis for town centre parking management plans.
