## REPORT

### New Zealand Community Boards Conference

1. Reflect, Refresh, Revitalise was the theme for the conference. Those words more than describe what the conference meant for me. The other theme was - Expectations and had they been met? For me, yes. Our four Community Boards received the Highly Recommended Award for our Unsung Heroes Awards. This was a great achievement for us as the awards were open to 144 Community Boards. Mayor Bob Parker talked of his support for Community Boards and how they were an integral part of his Council and for those of us who have attended these events know how supportive Christchurch City Council has always been for their Community Boards. Prime Minister John Key stayed at our opening dinner for four hours and gave a refreshing speech about the absolute need for grass roots action to be an integral part of Council.
2. Minister for Local Government New Zealand, Rodney Hide was the speaker at one plenary session and informed us of his thoughts and informed us about the changes he will try to put into action. Although only one man he was sure that the model for Auckland could be a blueprint for New Zealand.
3. Two other speakers who held my attention were Dr Philip Bagshaw, Charity Hospital and North and South New Zealander 2008 and Mayor Lawrence Yule, President of Local Government New Zealand. Dr. Bagshaw talked about the long hard task of forming a Charity Hospital and the community involvement it took to for his dream to materialize. Volunteers run the hospital, from the surgeons to the cleaners, and it made one reflect on the work it takes to be in a community to achieve such an outcome which is very inspiring. Mayor Lawrence did not mince words regarding Community Boards; he wanted to see more Mayors participating in the conferences. He explained that he valued Community Boards and was very aware about some councils who would not work alongside the Community Boards and hoped that would change in the future.
4. The days were filled with workshops on 'Strategic Development to Vibrant Communities' which was very informative for me. The disaster event was exceptional and none of us were prepared for this. We all participated in a Civil Defence exercise of an earthquake. This was so well received and Civil Defence made us see how important the role of Community Boards can be in a disaster. This needs to be picked up by Waitakere as it is important and never more so than now. I guess this is a challenge I am putting out for we the Community Boards may be the missing link in a full on disaster situation.
5. I will stop here as a book could be written if one had the energy. However, to finish Yvonne Palmer has retired as the Chair of the National Executive and Mike Cohen is now the Chairman, congratulations Mike. Thank you Owena for your support and for participating with the Community Board Members, I enjoyed your company.
6. A little saying – "Just because you don't get invited to the party, does not stop you dancing in the now."

## 10 COMMUNITY WELLBEING LOCAL FUND ALLOCATION - APRIL 2009

### GLOSSARY

New Lynn Community Board	(NLCB)
Community Wellbeing Local Fund	(CWLF)

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to provide the New Lynn Community Board (NLCB) with information related to the New Lynn Ward applications to the Community Wellbeing Local Fund (CWLF).

One New Lynn Ward application was received for the April 2009 round of the CWLF and is deemed eligible by Council's Community Grants Officer.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that New Lynn Community Board resolve to:

1. **Receive** the Community Wellbeing Local Fund Allocation - April 2009 report.
2. **Agree** to consider the New Lynn Ward application to the Community Wellbeing Local Fund Allocation - April 2009 and allocate funding as per the Community Assistance Fund Policy and Guidelines.

## **BACKGROUND**

1. The CWLF provides small sums of monetary assistance in the way of grants to a wide range of groups in the community, who provide local services and activities on a voluntary or 'not-for-profit' basis.
2. The Council allocates an amount of \$113,000, of which \$56,500 is allocated to Citywide projects by the Finance and Operational Performance Committee. The balance is allocated to each Community Board on a ward population basis.
3. The CWLF is open throughout the year. If applications are received two weeks prior to the report being due, they are processed and reported to the respective Community Boards. Applications received after this date are processed and reported on the following month.
4. In April 2008, the Finance and Operational Performance Committee agreed to the criteria of the Community Wellbeing Grants as part of the Community Assistance Funds restructure and policy development:

*The Finance and Operational Performance Committee resolved to:*

*“2. **Approve** the recommended option for the Community Assistance Funds restructure and policy development.”*

*580/2008*

5. In May 2008, a final workshop was held with all four Community Boards to outline the policies and procedures. At the workshop the Community Boards agreed:
  - The criteria be expanded to include applications from individuals;
  - That every eligible applicant be given the opportunity to present their application to the respective Community Board;
  - To enable organisations to apply for cultural activities;
  - That catering costs may only be accepted as part of a larger programme or activity to a maximum sum of \$250; and
  - NOTE: In general, support will not be provided to organisations that request assistance for activities that promote religious and or political beliefs unless they are proven to have community benefit.

## DECISION MAKING

### Issues

#### Promotion

6. The following methods were used to advertise and promote the CWLF:
  - Two advertisements in the Western Leader on 26 June 2008 and 10 July 2008;
  - Community Assistance Newsletter - posted to 1,000 community groups January, April and November 2008;
  - CWLF workshop, 15 July 2008;
  - Waitakere City Council website; and
  - Information and application forms were provided to all libraries, Community Centres and Citizens Advice Bureaux.
7. Although significant advertising of the CWLF was undertaken, it is of concern that there were a low number of applications submitted. Therefore, it is proposed that regular reviews take place to identify ongoing improvements in the promotion of the CWLF

#### Assessment of Options

8. The NLCB has one eligible application to be considered for financial assistance with the total amount requested being \$500. The maximum amount each applicant may apply for is \$1,500.
9. The Community Grants Officer has assessed the application against the Community Assistance Funds Policy and Guidelines (Policy and Guidelines) and deems the application to be eligible for consideration by the NLCB. Below is a summary of the application and the amount requested:

10. The total amount available for the 2008/2009 financial year is \$17,078 of which \$9562.50 has been allocated leaving \$7,515.50 available for the remainder of the year.
11. The assessment on the application has been based on the information provided in the application and alignment to the eligibility criteria outlined in the Policy and Guidelines.
12. Once the decision has been reached at the New Lynn Community Board meeting, confirmation of payment to the applicant is forwarded to the Community Grants Officer to distribute to the successful applicants. All other conditions are set out by the individual Community Boards. The summary of the application is attached at page A1.

## STRATEGIC CONTEXT

13. The Local Government Act 2002 states that as part of the preparation of the Long Term Council Community Plan a set of community outcomes must be identified for the City. The Council takes these into account in the formulation of its strategic direction and budgeting and provides a mandated set of strategic outcomes against which to assess grants.
14. A number of the Council's Community Outcomes and the Council's Strategic Platforms and Priorities have a strong connection to social wellbeing. The Community Outcomes and Strategic Platforms and Priorities are the key areas against which the Community Wellbeing Funds are assessed. The key Community Outcomes include; Strong Communities, Toiora, Urban and Rural Villages and Working Together. The Council Platforms are Strong Communities and Urban and Rural Villages.

## CONSULTATION

15. Consultation on the CWLF was between the Leisure Section and Community Boards.

## RESOURCES

16. The NLCB has a total of \$17,078 to allocate during the 2008/2009 financial year. There is \$7,515.50 remaining for this financial year.

## IMPLEMENTATION ISSUES

17. There are no implementation issues.

## 11 GREAT NORTH ROAD, NEW LYNN - NEW CLEARWAY 7AM TO 9AM AND 4PM TO 6PM MONDAY TO FRIDAY PARKING RESTRICTION

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to seek the New Lynn Community Board's approval for a new Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday parking restriction on Great North Road, New Lynn on the south kerb between Veronica Street and Stock Street.

Council officers consulted with the businesses directly affected and have taken into consideration the best option for businesses and the community.

Two options have been identified, to install the Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday parking restriction or to have the area remain unrestricted.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the New Lynn Community Board resolve to:

1. **Receive** the Great North Road, New Lynn - New Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday Parking Restriction report.

2. **Approve** that in relation to **GREAT NORTH ROAD, NEW LYNN:**
  - (a) and in accordance with the powers conferred by virtue of the Local Government Act 1974, the Land Transport Act 1998, the Transport Act 1962 and the Waitakere City Council Bylaw No. 7, 1991 – Traffic, the following restriction now be resolved to be specified and imposed, namely,
    - (i) on the north kerb line of **GREAT NORTH ROAD**, starting from a point approximately 20 metres east of the eastern kerb line of Veronica Street and extending east for a distance of approximately 70 metres the **CLEARWAY 7AM TO 9AM AND 4PM TO 6PM MONDAY TO FRIDAY** parking restriction be put in place.
    - (ii) on the north kerb line of **GREAT NORTH ROAD**, starting from a point approximately 6 metres east of the eastern kerb line of Bentinck Street and extending east for a distance of approximately 50 metres the **CLEARWAY 7AM TO 9AM AND 4PM TO 6PM MONDAY TO FRIDAY** parking restriction be put in place.
    - (iii) on the north kerb line of **GREAT NORTH ROAD**, starting from a point approximately 6 metres east of the eastern kerb line of Crum Avenue and extending east for a distance of approximately 40 metres the **CLEARWAY 7AM TO 9AM AND 4PM TO 6PM MONDAY TO FRIDAY** parking restriction be put in place.
3. **Agree** that the appropriate signage and/or road markings, in accordance with the provisions of the Land Transport Rule; Traffic Control Devices 2004 – Rule 54002 hereby be approved to be put in place to properly establish, delineate and record the said parking limitation and restriction.

## BACKGROUND

1. A request for a Clearway parking restriction was received from a resident that uses this route on Great North Road to travel to work on a daily basis. The resident has concerns that during the peak traffic flows (both morning and afternoon) it is very frustrating and unnecessary to have to move from the left hand lane into the right hand lane due to vehicles parking on the side of the road during peak traffic times.

## DECISION MAKING

### Issues

2. Great North Road is a regional arterial road and carries approximately 21,240 vehicles per day.
3. The location of the proposed changes are indicated on the diagram attached at page A2.

### Options Identified

4. Two options have been identified: to put in a Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday parking restriction, or to have the area remain unrestricted.

### Consideration of Community Views

5. Verbal consultation with affected businesses was conducted in the month of February 2009. Two objections were received and the other two businesses advised they believed it was necessary to have a designated clearway on this road.

### Preferred Option

6. The new Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday parking restriction is recommended to allow vehicles travelling during peak traffic times an uninterrupted travel experience whilst travelling to work etc. When traffic is at its peak on regional arterial roads, parked vehicles in traffic lanes compromises traffic safety.
7. The preferred option is to put in the Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday parking restriction to improve traffic safety.

### STRATEGIC CONTEXT

8. Council's Integrated Transport and Communication platform provides the strategic context for this report. The vision is for public transport and communications systems that provide fast, effective services, and for City travel facilitated by integrated, environmentally-responsible and innovative design, with a focus on meeting the essential needs of all, for access, communication, and safety.
9. Clearway parking restrictions can be applied to ensure efficient, safe movement on roads by keeping traffic lanes and visibility lines clear.

### CONSULTATION

10. Consultation with internal staff, external agencies and Maori, was not required for this report.

### RESOURCES

11. The new Clearway 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm Monday to Friday parking restriction can be implemented under the Annual Plan 2008/2009 maintenance budgets.

### IMPLEMENTATION ISSUES

12. There are no implementation issues.
