**Service : Grants and Assistance**

Council adopted in 1998 the Community Assistance Policy, the goal of the Policy is to help strengthen the ability of local community groups to create a strong social base for Waitakere City and to meet local needs.

Waitakere City Council considers central government to be responsible for paying for welfare related social services and providing the main support for the not for profit sector. It does not wish to duplicate this role.

Council targets its assistance to strengthen the viability and develop the capacity of the City's not for profit sector. By supplying some of the basic infrastructure (such as buildings) required to maintain the sector, Council can help develop the social base of the City. Groups are better placed to apply for project based funding if they have sufficient resources and support to keep themselves up and running.

Council also considers co-operation and networking within the not for profit sector critical to the viability and effective functioning of the sector. Co-ordination is an important part of Council's role and it is committed to providing support that encourages co-operation and networking.

**TE TAUMATA RUNANGA REQUESTS ACCOMMODATION FOR MAORI WARDENS**

Council are currently investigating locating the Maori Wardens in premises in Tui Glen, the lease process is underway. A funding application has been made to Waitakere Licensing Trust to support them for further buildings on this site. Council will continue to work with Waitemata Maori Wardens to relocate them.

See submission.</p>	<p><b>Service : Trees New and Maintenance</b> <b>PLANTING FRUIT TREES WITHIN ROAD RESERVE</b> Council's Draft Tree Plan identifies a number of species of food producing trees that are suitable for planting within Waitakere City, these include feijoa, olive, crab apple, Spanish chestnut and other ornamental fruiting species which have a proven history in performance within Waitakere City's urban environment. Plantings of potential crop trees have been undertaken recently at sites such as Jack Colvin Place (olive) and Forrest Hill Park (Spanish chestnut). Council also recognises, in areas such as Oraita, that fruit trees represent an important link to the past and this has been endorsed within Reserve Management Plans such as Sunvue Park, where the main theme is an apple orchard style planting. Council continues to utilise a variety of trees within plantings, appropriate to the site and conditions, which encourage a diversity of species. Residents are encouraged to contact Council with tree planting requests and there are also community based street tree planting programmes run by Keep Waitakere Beautiful. These planting programmes give residents the opportunity to nominate streets and request specific tree species. I believe the Hui Taumata Mātauranga process is still very worthwhile, with wide ranging benefits and outcomes for us as a people and the nation as a whole.


