Waitakere Trust Art Awards Open for Entries

Currently in their twenty-fourth year, the venerable Waitakere Trust Art Awards and the Lincoln Green Sculpture Award showcase West Auckland talent and rewards artists with a range of cash prizes.

This year, the new "Looking West" award adds to the prize pool. Generously sponsored by the Revell Family Trust, \$500 will be awarded to the work which most strongly celebrates the West Auckland spirit, selected from all the categories. "With the imminent establishment of the Auckland Supercity we felt very keenly the need to celebrate our love of the West Auckland culture and environs" explains Megan Carter, coordinator of the Waitakere Central Community Arts Council. The Council is a not-for-profit volunteer organization of artists charged with the task of organizing the Awards exhibition each year.

Once again the exhibition will be held in Project Space at the Corban Estate Arts Centre from November 4 to 15. Works not selected for competition will be exhibited in the beautiful Old St Michaels Church next door. Entries close October 2. Entry forms are available from WCCAC (see the back page for contact information) and from local Waitakere City Libraries or Arts Councils nationwide.
