Going West Festival Highlights

Going West Books & Writers Weekend 2006

In the closing stages of Going West's mid-September literary weekend at the Titirangi Memorial Hall happy punters with glasses of local wine in their hands relaxed to the melancholic but comforting sound of Hammond Gamble's bluesy voice and acoustic guitar. The theme for the weekend was "The Truth about Stories" – audience and guest authors may not have pinned down the truth but a fine time was had trying!

Graphic novelist Dylan Horrocks took us on an intellectual adventure based on his experiences while working with physicists for the book *Are Angels Ok?* According to Dylan, art is an attempt to find out what is true with writers re-enchanting an otherwise meaningless universe.

Making the connection between art and writing is also the forte of Greg O'Brien, author of the popular *Welcome to the South Seas*. Having him in the spotlight expertly interviewed by Paula Green was an unusual opportunity to hear what fires up this enthusiastic promoter of our writers and artists.

"The impulse to go surfing", says Greg, "is the same as the impulse to make art". Changing roles he interviewed artist and truly original spirit Jacqueline Fahey about her memoir *Something for the Birds*. Jacqueline's commitment to speaking frankly coupled with her natural flamboyance provoked laughter and tears in equal measure.

The electrifying performances of Pasifika poets Selina Tusitala Marsh and Tusiata Avia turned upside down the stereotypes and colonized views of Pacific Island women. They are spearheading a new wave of Pacific writers that Huia Publishers celebrates in the anthology *Niu Voices* due out in November and edited by Selina.

"Poetry roadie" Roger Steele's tandem act with poet Glenn Colquhoun seduced the audience with amiable banter then Glenn lay bare the joy of falling in love and the pain of a broken heart from the pages of his forthcoming collection *How we fell* (Steele Roberts). The audience was with him every inch of the way.

This year's unpredictable, emotionally charged moment happened during question time for Julian Novitz on his first novel *Holocaust Tours* when an elderly man in the front row rose to speak. A Holocaust survivor from Latvia he wanted Julian to know how important it was that young people like him are still prepared to write about the topic.

Visiting Australian author Anna Funder of *Stasiland* fame picked up on similar concerns about the uses of memory: "to remember or to forget — which is healthier?"

Back in New Zealand territory the opening night session with Richard Nunns and Brian Flintoff on the revival of taonga puoro (traditional Maori instruments) reminded us of the important jour-

ney travelled by these two with the late Hirini Melbourne to retrieve this cultural knowledge from oblivion. Shortly after their moving presentation Unity Books, the festival bookseller, sold out of Brian's seminal book *Singing Treasures*.

These were just some of the highlights of a successful weekend that also featured the dignified Patricia Grace and the savvy New Orleans-based Westie born and bred writer Paula Morris. Now in its eleventh year Going West enjoyed record attendances. Writers and readers all in the one venue sharing food, wine and conversations during breaks from the formal presentations created a special communal experience that is the essence of Going West.
