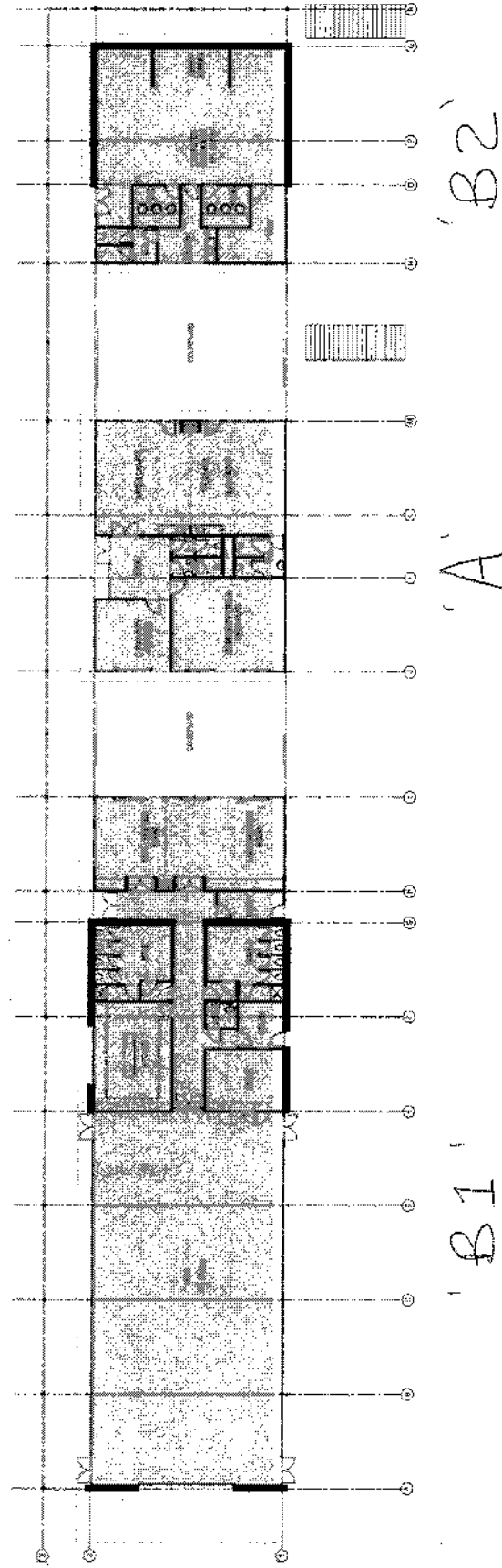

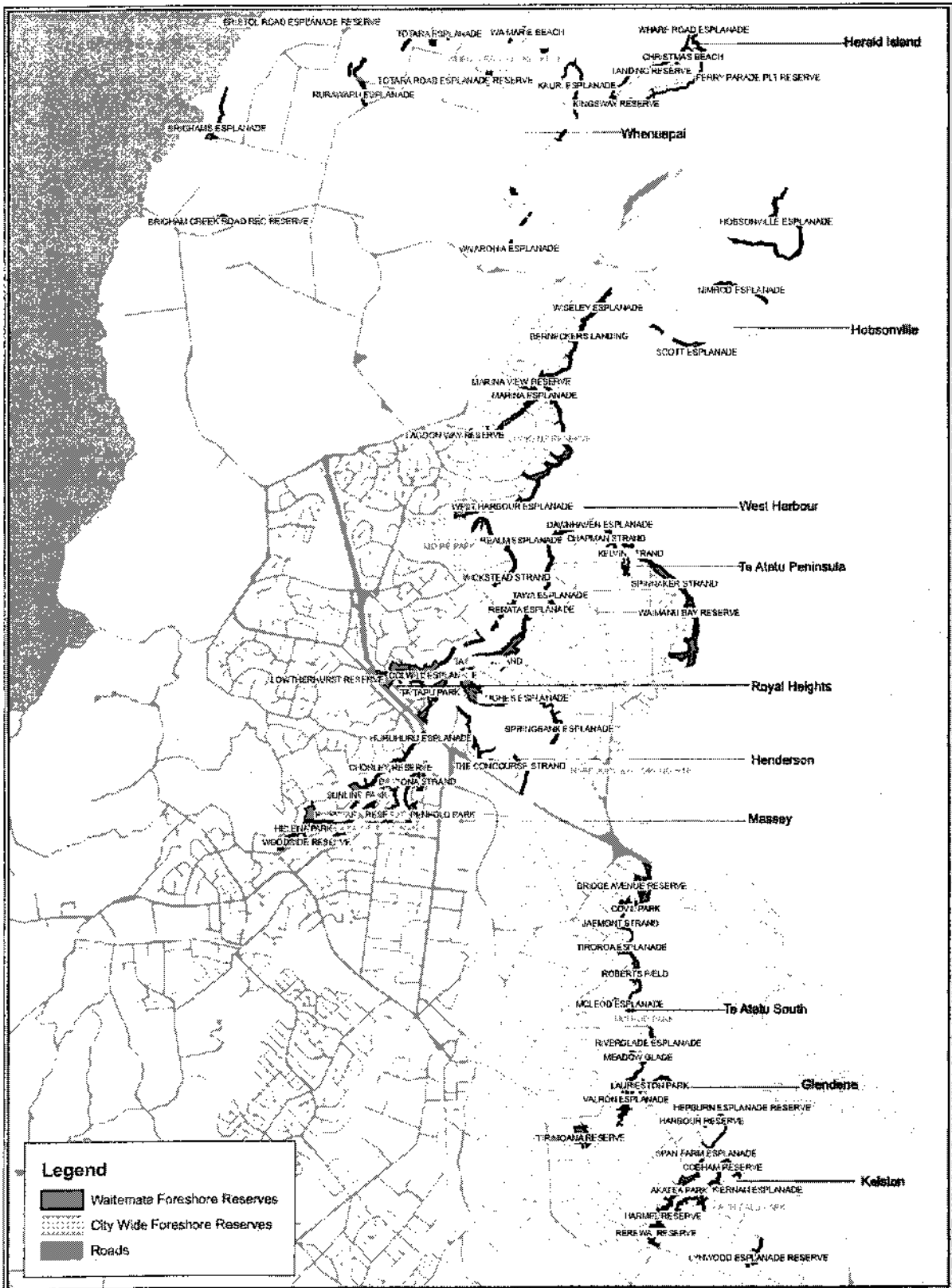


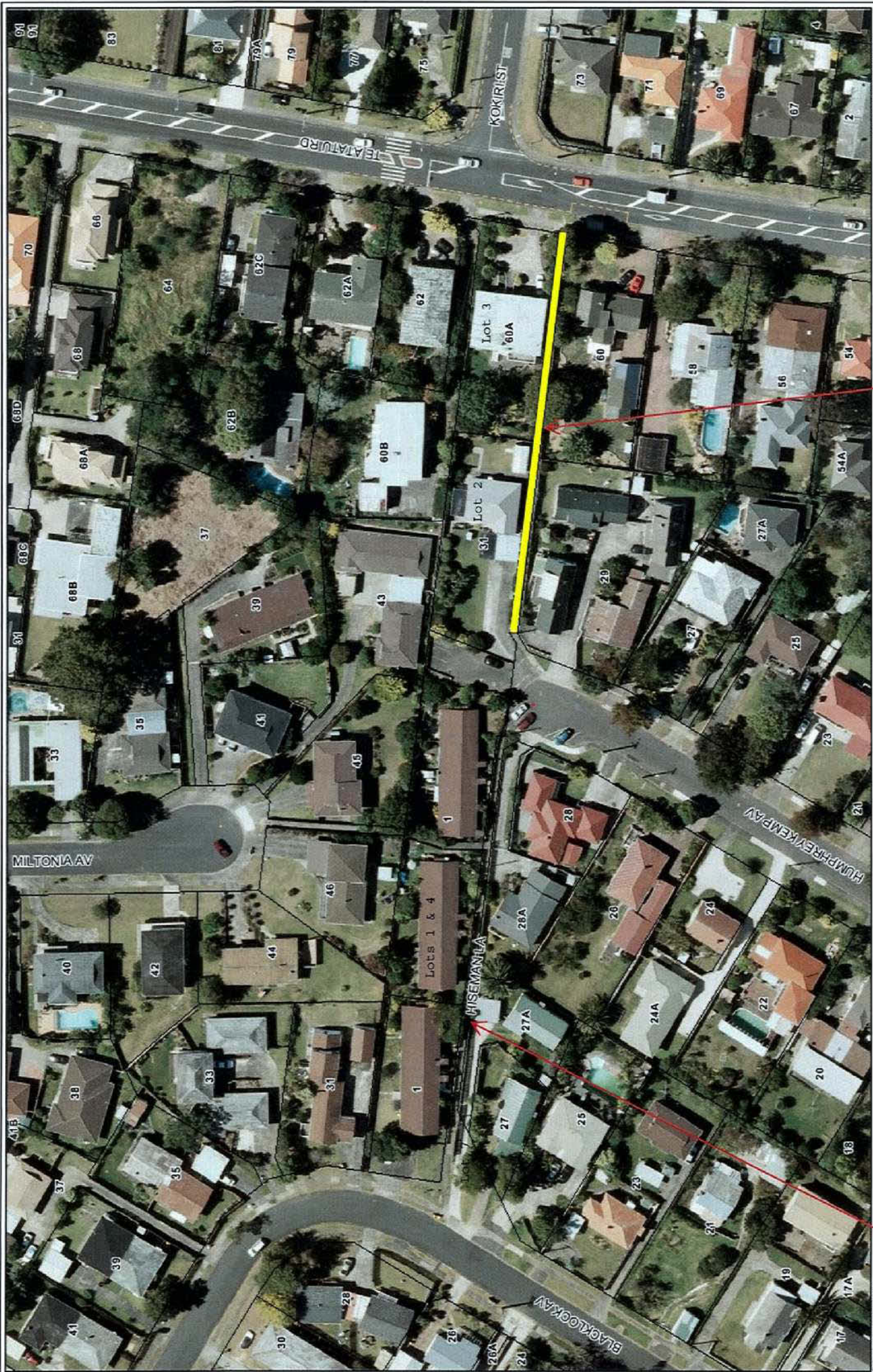

Dear resident of property in Hiseman Lane Henderson, or of property adjacent to it.

Re: Acceptability of a proposal to change the name of the portion of Hiseman Lane between Humphrey Kemp Ave and Te Atatu Rd. to Fuller Lane.

Firstly, apologies for the impersonal form of address. Your cooperation is sought on the above proposal but I have no means of knowing your name or address.

I write on behalf of myself, brothers Charles, Leslie and Lionel and in memory of our parents John and Emma Fuller and brothers Frederick and Gilbert.

In 1914 our parents, who had migrated from England bought a rough piece of gumland of approximately 3ha on Te Atatu Rd. Along the entire southern boundary was an unformed road reserve now named Hiseman Lane, Henderson. They established an orchard on the property and lived out their lives there, raising six sons.

Our mother pre-deceased our father and when he died there were insufficient funds to subdivide and develop the property so it was sold as a block. In reflection and with a very deep sense of nostalgia, we have now come to the realisation that there is no reference point in Te Atatu Rd. to which we or descendants of our parents can relate. This homestead represented their first and only home together in a new land. Even we who lived our childhood there find absolutely nothing recognisable and we seek an opportunity to have the family name recorded for posterity.

Our investigation of Hiseman Lane reveals that the eastern portion between Humphrey Kemp Ave. and Te Atatu Rd. not only has no access for traffic but there are also no properties fronting onto it and therefore no letterboxes.

We are currently making inquiries with the Waitakere City Council to determine whether a name change of this section of the lane to Fuller Lane would be acceptable and as a primary requirement have gained approval from NZ Post. We are now required to canvass residents to seek their approval.

Since the proposal does not impair the respected integrity of the Hiseman family name, doesn't require any adjustment of postal information and will not impose any cost on residents, we are hopeful it will engender support.

With this objective in mind, a form is enclosed seeking the name and address of residents and their signature hopefully confirming that they have no objection to the name change. A stamped, addressed envelope is enclosed for reply. If no reply has been received by 14th Sept., it is likely that a personal contact will be sought.



We would prefer that this contact could be personal but that involves problems of both logistics and time. My brothers may, however, be able to overcome these difficulties. If not, they will have resorted to a letterbox drop.

It would no doubt be of interest to you to know what the area looked like in the era of our childhood and why it holds such nostalgic memories. I therefore enclose a copy of an aerial photo taken about 1925, probably by Bob Johnson, an aviator who lived on the intersection of Te Atatu Rd and McLeod Rd. His house is a focal point of the photo and still stands. It is now No 111 and has a stained glass aeroplane in the front door. Our house in the front part of our orchard was demolished long ago but that of our neighbour, now fronting Miltonia Ave survives. We are a weakening link with a time when the most significant feature above the soil level of your property was either grass, trees or a five wire fence.

Three of us recently stood at the lower end of Humphrey Kemp Ave reminiscing over our childhood memories of the specific area at a time when the surroundings were only pasture, a row of shelter pines and our orchard. We shared a strong common feeling that your collective presence was an intrusion into our past. You represented aliens in our territory! A deep realisation of a great paradox then dawned. As three suspicious-looking old codgers loitering in the narrow lane, we in fact represented intruders into your present. We are now the aliens! We seek a passport into your territory while we still have the strength to wield a pen. Your cooperation would be sincerely appreciated.
