Patrol Function

Local patrols have recorded the following activity during this reporting period:

The percentage of drivers found to be driving drunk is below the national average at 0.25%.

Fatal Crashes

There were 2 fatal crashes in Waitakere in the 1st third of the year.

1. *State Highway 16, Whenuapai. 4 July, 0930 hours.*
A 39 year old female was killed. It appears that she over corrected after drifting left and crossed the centreline into the path of a bus. She was on a learner licence and should not have been by herself in the car.
2. *Upper Harbour Dr, Hobsonville. 26 July, 0030 hours.*
A 23 year old male died. He was intoxicated and driving on a restricted licence. He attempted to overtake another vehicle on a corner and lost control, crashing into a culvert. Speed was also a factor.

Campaigns

Both speed and safety belt campaigns were carried out during this period.

Meetings

Police staff have attended meetings with Council officials in relation to road safety matters within the City.

Conclusion

The total number of speed notices issued has increased considerably as Police are focussing on enforcing the lower speed ranges. The LTSA speed survey has shown a slight decrease in the mean speed in the city.

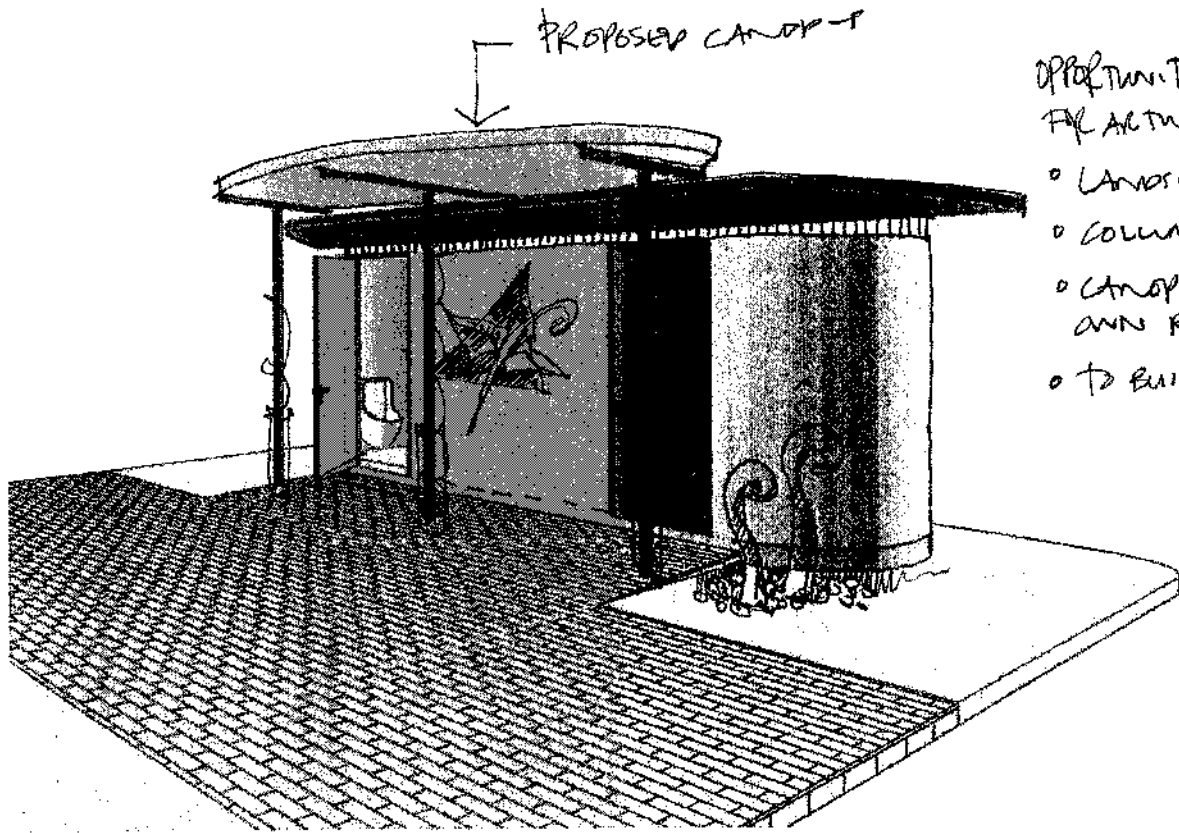
Alcohol enforcement is to be stepped up, especially with the holiday season coming up as the number of crashes with alcohol as a factor has shown a slight upward trend.

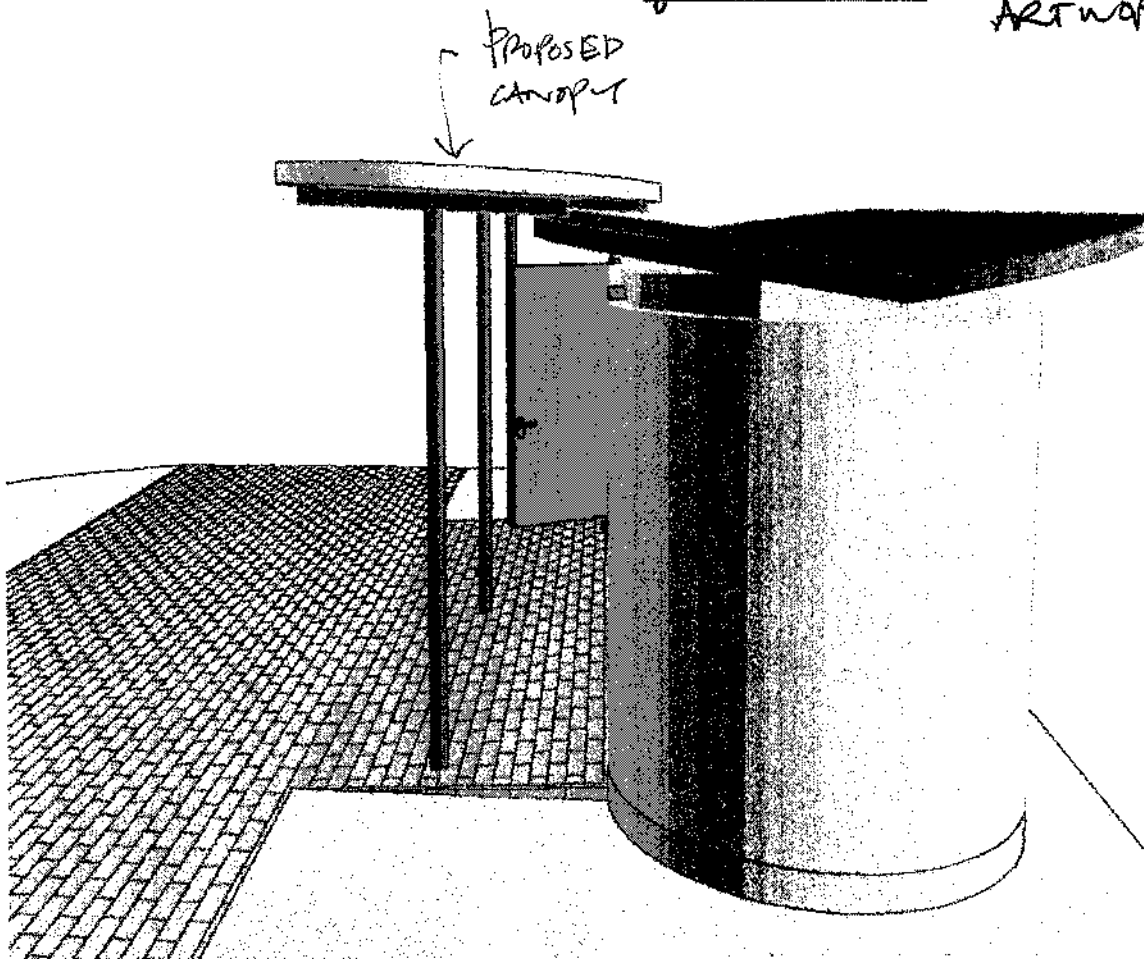

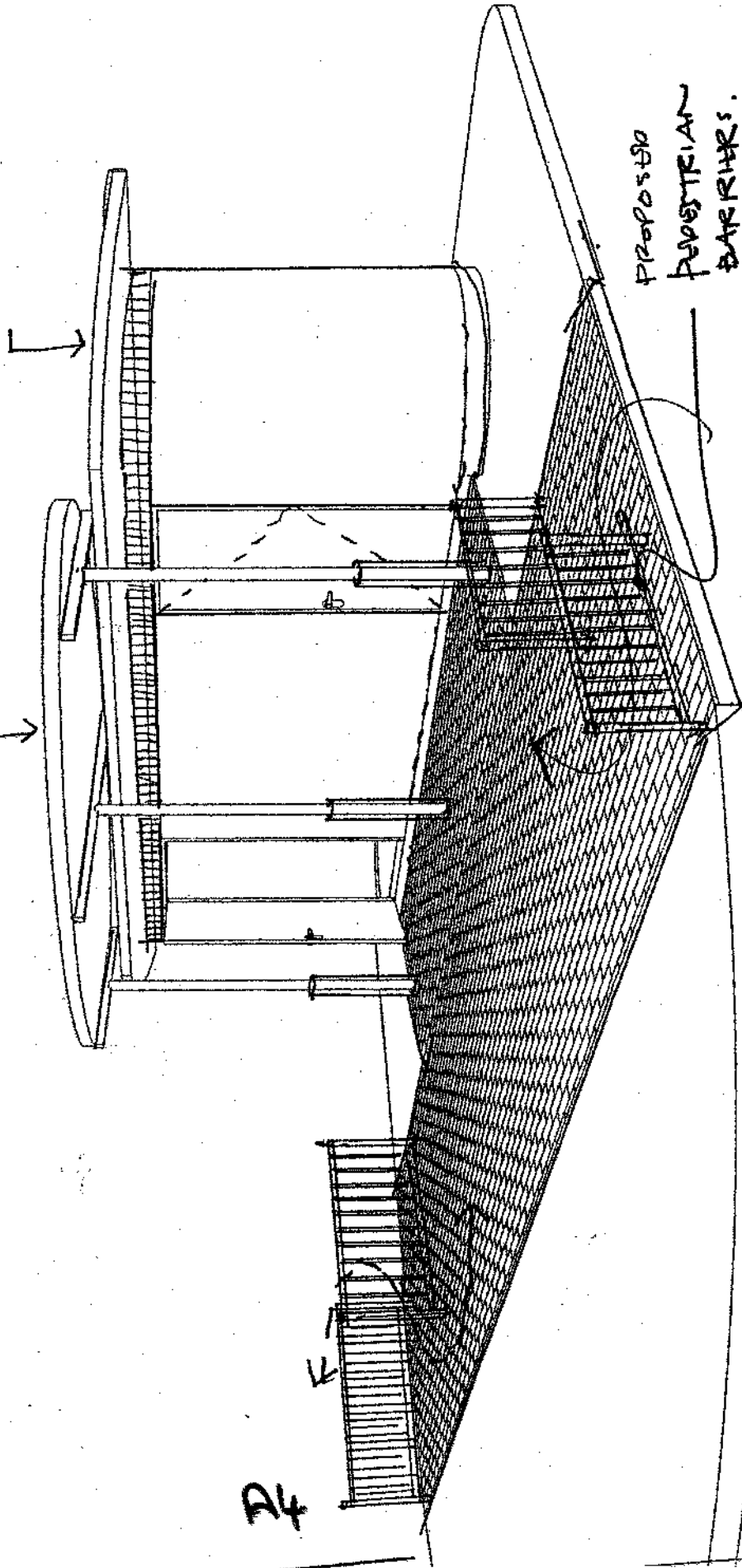

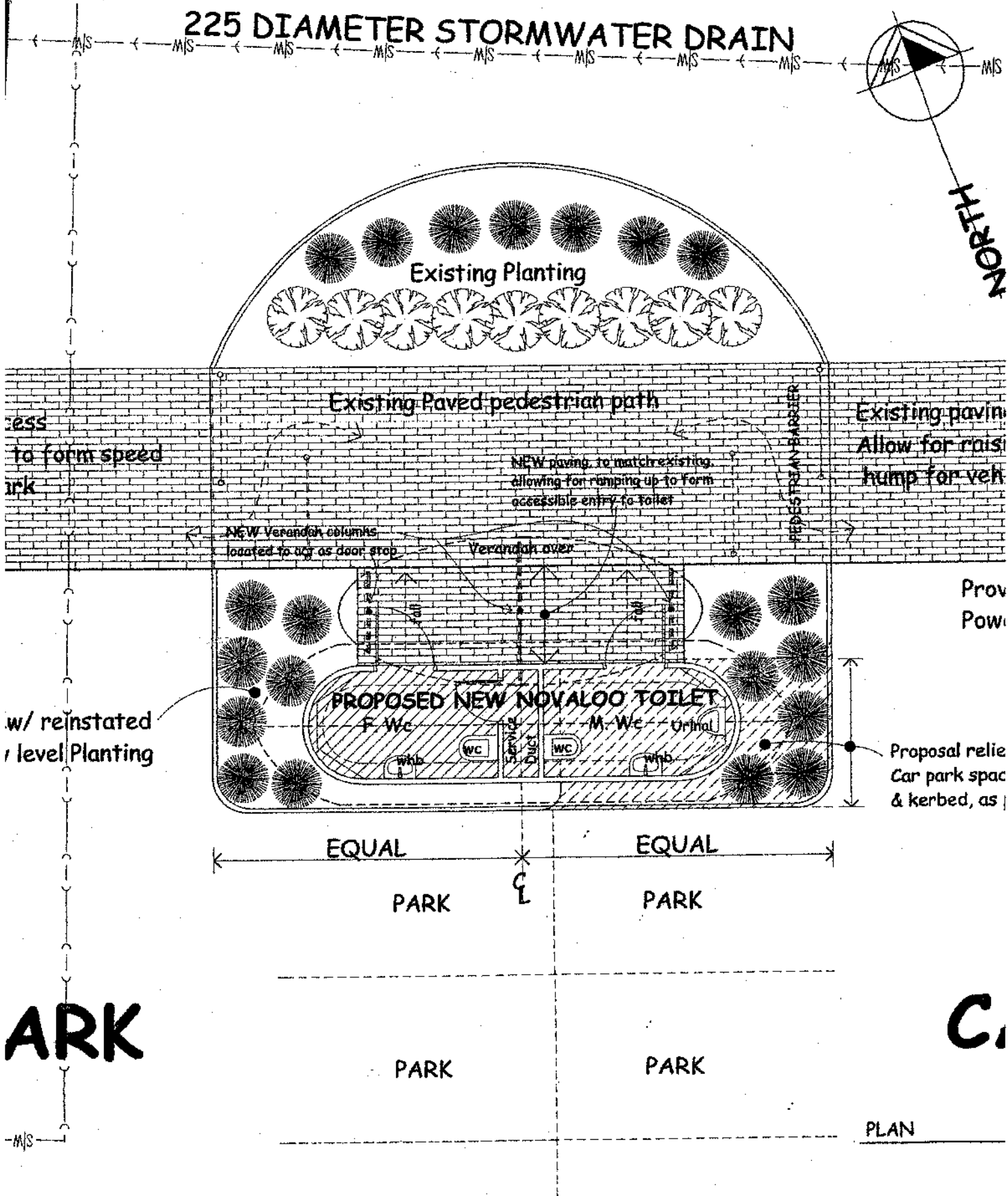
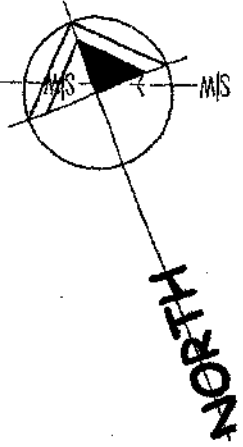
