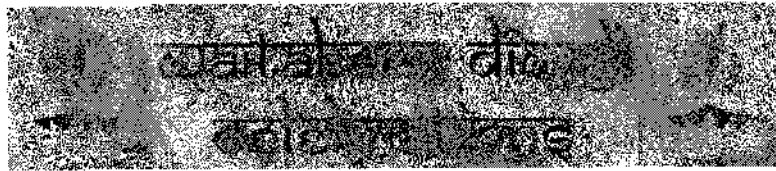

Despite the indoor fireworks incident, where an overcharged firecracker hit the ceiling of the stadium causing minor smouldering to a small fragment of the ceiling insulating material and as a precaution the building was cleared, participants returned to the indoor stadium to complete the programme after the Fire Service reps that were present on site determined that it was safe for re-entry. As some of the stage equipment had to be turned off as a precautionary measure, Radio Tarana came to the party by providing music for the performers to complete their shows and to entertain the audience. The evening ended with a spectacular outdoor fireworks display.

This grand success of the celebrations has been achieved by your contributions and the credit goes to the sponsors, performers, volunteers and everyone who took their time out to be part of the celebrations and to express their love and to show their respect for our great festival. The highlight of our festival was the Ram Leela drama, in which the students of Waitakere Indian Association Hindi School performed so admirably.

On behalf of the Diwali Committee, I wish to extend my sincerest gratitude and tons of thanks for making 2007 Waitakere Diwali a great success. I am extremely overwhelmed by the response from the diverse ethnic communities of Waitakere and the greater Auckland region for their contribution & generosity, which added prominence and significance to this event.
