WCCAC Artists Offer Portraiture Service

The Waitakere Central Arts Council is looking for well known and not so well known citizens young or old, who would like to have their portrait painted by an artist from WCCACs talented membership. The painted portrait is historically, and still today, the most satisfying way to pass on the appearance and personality of a family member to later generations.

Portraiture sessions are held every Wednesday at 'The Studio'. They begin at 9.30am, with the sitter posing from 10am until 12 noon with breaks. Sitters need to return each Wednesday for 4 to 6 weeks until works are completed. Some stillness is required and every effort will be made to have the sitter comfortably seated and posed.

Artists work in a variety of mediums and position themselves around the sitter; they also take a photographic record in order to work on background and clothing between sessions. Sitters allow several artists to paint/draw them and in exchange they are invited to purchase the portraits of their choice at a reduced rate.

Project Twin Streams Makes its Mark

The hard work and dedication of the schools and community groups involved in adopting and restoring Project Twin Streams stream-bank areas have been recognised with a series of community participation mosaic projects. Project Twin Streams Arts Coordinator Janet Holt guided the mosaic making schemes with assistance from artists Kristen Kell and Norbryne Eyre.

The youngest contributors were 3 and 4 year old students at Cranwell Park Early Childhood Centre (Barnados), who created eel mosaics with the tiles inset into a fallen log to show passers-by that the children have helped to care for, and plant trees near, the stream-bank of Henderson Creek at Tui Glen Reserve. Centre staff created a Barnados tile mosaic.



On the Waikumete stream, a mosaic embellished post was created by students of Sunnyvale Primary School to mark their adopted area.

Another identity marker, at Serwayne Place, Sunnyvale, was created by senior students of Holy Cross Primary School. Vicky Coakley, a teacher at Holy Cross Primary, said, "This post signifies our school's partnership with Project Twin Streams and our role as caretakers of the native tree planting established in 2008."
