## Matariki 2010: Te Tau Hou

*Ka puta a Matariki, ka rere a Whānui, ko te tohu o te tau.*

*(Matariki (Pleiades) reappears, Whānui (Vega) starts its flight, this being the sign of the time of the year.)*

Once a year, Matariki (the Pleiades) appears in the sky, bringing Te Tau Hou (the Māori New Year). Matariki heralds the beginning of the cold season and was traditionally time for staying indoors, wananga (schools of learning) and celebrating the rest before Spring. Today, we affirm these themes in the light of the present.

Waitakere City Council is supporting a wide range of activities and events for Matariki, showcasing the diversity of Maori arts, customs, and culture. Check out events in this newsletter or contact Mei Hill, WCC Maori Arts Coordinator for more information (see back page for contact details).

## Creative Communities Scheme Funding Available

The Creative Communities Scheme aims to increase local participation in the arts and to extend the diversity of arts available to communities. A maximum of \$5,000 can be applied for, and eligible projects must take place within Waitakere City, benefit the local community and have an arts or cultural focus. Applications close on Friday July 16.

Due to pending local governance changes, Creative Communities will deliver the entire year's funding in one round only. There will be no further funding until after July 2011.

## New Art Studio Opens in Parau

The Art Post Studio opened its doors at 624 Huia Rd Parau in March. Just 10 minutes from Titirangi on the way to Huia, the building was originally a post office and general store.

A collective of Waitakere artists (including Nicky Hartley, Kym Marsden, Tracy Henderson, Eleanor Barker, Louise Taylor, Marie McNeill, Leonie Clapham, and Leah Wilson), the child friendly studio features paintings, found objects/recycled art, pottery, prints, scenic photography and cards. Stamps are sold at the old post office desk and children enjoy posting into the old post box outside.

The Art Post is open every weekend from 10am to 4pm. EFTPOS is not available, so bring cash.
